Macintosh counts at Garvan Institute

The Garvan Institute in Sydney is a world leader in research into new treatments and causes of breast cancer, osteoporosis, diabetes and neurological diseases. As a medical research organisation dependent on government and community support, it has to monitor all financial aspects of its operations.

To improve purchase management, cost tracking and accountability, Garvan has introduced Sapphire financial management software for its administration which runs on 10 of the 150 Apple Macintosh personal computers.

Soon the network will be extended to cater for 400 users, and Sapphire's use expanded to include automated ordering of supplies directly by scientists.

"It is a purchasing-driven system that produces much more meaningful data and significantly eliminates paperwork," explains Matthew Cranitch, Manager, Finance and Accounting.

"The revolutionary aspect of Sapphire running on the Macs is the availability of data that gives the program manager not only a full description of what has been ordered, but how many and

by whom. Before, they just got the total cost.

"The second great benefit is cost tracking. We have about 50 research projects worth several million dollars. People need to be able to see a report on where the money is spent for each project, so it's very important to be able to track that expenditure."

When stage two of the Sapphire implementation rolls out, Garvan scientists will be able to requisition everything from test tubes and syringes to \$40,000 pieces of scientific equipment via the Mac, further streamlining the ordering process and greatly improving efficiency, accountability and the quality of information available to project heads.


Payroll is also done in Sapphire, eliminating the need to transfer enormous paper journals to Garvan's in-house system every month.
